Welcome to Term 3 at the Central Coast Conservatorium. Term 2 was action packed with many excellent concerts, workshops and opportunities for the students, families and friends of CCC.

My journey to date, at CCC has involved many steep learning curves as well as the odd speed bump but I can honestly say that I have a fantastic job. CCC is a vibrant hub of artistic activity that nurtures the cultural enrichment of our region and I am elated to be onboard.

For me the highlight of Term 2 was the Premier Ensembles Concert in June with CC Chamber Orchestra, CC Jazz Ensemble, CC Wind Orchestra, CC Children's Choirs and the CC Youth Orchestra all delivering outstanding performances in Gosford Anglican Church. The exceptional performance of the evening was the world premiere of Adrian Bell's Concertino In D for Viola and Orchestra by the CC Youth Orchestra with soloist Olivia Bell and conductor John Nottle. This was a truly special occasion with father, daughter, conductor and orchestra receiving a standing ovation. This performance exemplifies the caliber of musician on the Central Coast at CCC. Laura Chegwiddden (pictured below) was awarded her Certificate IV earlier this year and received her graduating certificate at the concert. She has been an outstanding CCC student and has recently accepted a place at Newcastle University studying a Bachelor of Music Degree. Laura will be missed in the many ensembles in which she participated.



I'd like to extend a warm welcome to Tim Page and Allan Royal to our Vocal Department, who also run the Triple Threat course. Congratulations to Tim Page for being appointed Head of Vocal Program.

Mini Strings Fest saw nearly 50 primary aged string players from Central Coast schools come together at CCC for a morning of workshops with our Strings Department. I was encouraged to see so many young musicians diligently working on new repertoire and concluding with a concert in the Anglican Church. It was a joy to see so many beaming young faces at the conclusion of the concert. We are looking to run another similar event in Term 4 this year.

We recently commenced the Pretty Beach Public School String Program with 26 students taking up the violin or cello there. The program is being delivered by two of our newest string tutors Peter Garrity (violin) and Sally Maer (Cello). I hope to meet many of these students at the next Mini String Fest.

Big Day Out this year saw over 200 school students from the Central Coast take part in a spectacular day of tutorials and concert. Conductors Robert Thompson and Phillip Rutherford directed the two lower level bands and showed excellent results at the concert. I conducted the highest level band for the day, which we called the Super Band. I was so impressed by these young musicians, that I have invited this band and its members to become part of our Premier Ensembles program at CCC. Super Band now rehearses weekly on Tuesday afternoons and is looking forward to a performance in early September at the NSSWE Spring Festival held at the Concourse, Chatswood. This band still has a number of positions vacant and we are currently looking for additional musicians. For more information about Super Band, please contact the office.

This year's Pearl Beach Scholarships Finals was different from previous years in that there were two concerts: a Junior Showcase and a Senior Scholarship, held on the 1st and 2nd of June. The Junior Showcase participants (non-competitive) performed beautifully and received a generous gift from the Pearl Beach Progress Association. The Senior Scholarship performances (competition), adjudicated by Warwick Ross, were also of an excellent standard. Eva Li (violin) won first place while Jasper Wand (oboe) placed second. All the CCC students who participated should be proud of their performances.

One of the most exciting events for 2013 will be the Central Coast Opera's production of *Help, Help, the Globolinks!* to be staged at Laycock Street Theatre in November. This CCC project has a comprehensive rehearsal schedule in Term 3 and is a first for the Central Coast as it is a full-scale opera production. I sincerely hope our musical community supports this endeavour, as I believe it will bring another cultural dimension to the Coast.

Term 2 was crucial for our Year 12 students preparing for their HSC performances in Term 3. I wish all our HSC candidates the very best of luck. A word of advice from a fellow musician: the hard work is done, focus not on the individual notes but on the message/story that you are portraying through the musical line and phrase of the music. Play from your heart and give everything you have.

IT'S ALL GO IN THE VOCAL DEPARTMENT

With rehearsals now in full swing for Central Coast Opera's production of Gian Carlo Menotti's 'space opera' - Help, Help, The Globolinks! it's all hands on deck to make this first production a real winner. Liliya Sile, Michaele Archer, Allan Royal and Tim Page have found a first class cast to fill all the major roles – in fact for some parts the talent available was so great they could have cast some three times over....so they did! The five performances are concentrated over the 15th and 16th of November at the Laycock Street Community Theatre but the multiple casting means that voices can be kept fresh and the company has a built-in insurance cover in case of any illness.

The opera premiered in 1968 in Hamburg, Germany, and has since been seen all over the globe. The opera's libretto, written by the composer, is a parable about the power of music to save the world – at least from Globolinks. The setting is a small boarding school and the surrounding woodland where the school bus has broken down loaded with children returning from their mid-year vacations. They realize that they are surrounded by invading aliens known only as Globolinks and from radio news broadcasts they learn that the only thing that seems to repel the invaders, is music. The only student to have her instrument with her, Emily, is sent off in search of the school with her only 'protection' being her violin. Meanwhile members of the school staff, worried by the non-arrival of the children, are galvanized into action by the music mistress, Madame Euterpova, as they form a band and leave the school in search of their pupils.

Menotti's most enduring opera is probably the work he wrote initially for television in 1951, Amahl And The Night Visitors a piece the Conservatorium produced in 2007. His other well known works include The Consul and The Saint Of Bleeker Street both of which were awarded Pulitzer prizes. Menotti was born in Italy but trained mostly at the Curtis Institute of Music where class mates included Leonard Bernstein and Samuel Barber. Although he was a populist, his works present plenty of musical and dramatic challenges for any company undertaking them. For the vocal department it is an all-involving activity as the casts' ages range from youngsters of seven or so up to veterans in their 70's! This production will be the first fully staged operatic work presented on the Central Coast and is a collaboration between the members of the Vocal Department, Bronwyn Russell and Joshua Maxwell, Choreographer and Designer respectively. The Central Coast Youth Orchestra, Conducted by John Nottle, will be accompanying the opera and sterling work is being done by staff in the Piano Department with their expert assistance as rehearsal pianists.

Don't miss seeing this opera at the Laycock Street Community Theatre from November 15th to 16th.

TRIPLE THREAT COURSE A SUCCESS

The term Triple Threat refers to people who can do several things well – in cricket it would be someone who can bat, bowl and field - all to a high standard; in musical theatre terms it's someone who can sing, act and dance. It used to be rare to find these multi-talented performers but these days it's almost expected and with jobs always scarce and hopefuls plentiful, it means those with the most skills will probably be those in the most work. The CCC asked local industry professionals, Tim Page and Allan Royal, to devise a course to assist students to round out their skills base and step up to become Triple Threats.

Each of the weekly two and a half hour sessions begins with a physical warm-up taken by the course's resident choreographer, Leisi Edmonds, followed by a vocal warm-up with Tim and Allan. This is followed by work on various ensembles, duets and solos as well as monologues and scene-work. The 22 regular attendees are currently working on pieces from Oklahoma, West Side Story, The Boy From Oz, Starting Here, Starting Now, A Chorus Line, Fiddler On The Roof and Closer Than Ever as well as numbers from shows that premiered in the 1920's to shows that opened on Broadway as recently as 2008. The joy for many is gaining confidence in singing, dancing and acting as well as working on such a diverse range of material. The age of the participants ranges from 11 up to experienced people in their 50's. The workshops help people with basic music theory and practice at holding a harmony line in the ensembles as well as finding the key to performing solos or monologues. Each participant should finish the course with a well prepared monologue and at least two songs that can be suitable for auditions. The course also covers the history of Musical Theatre, theatre and musical terms as well as audition practice. The plan is to present a showcase of the group's efforts at The Peninsular Theatre, Woy Woy, in early December 2013.

CMP NEWS

Term 2 and 3 are proving to be very busy for the Children's Music Program. It was very exciting having the Central Coast Express Advocate visit our baby music class and we received much interest from the article. Apart from reporting the wonderful benefits of music at a young age, they helped promote the open classes for babies and preschoolers which were held on Thursday July 11th for new students.

In Term 3, Level 2 students will commence learning the violin or cello. These instruments can now be hired from the Conservatorium (previously they remained at the Con) and we anticipate this will be an added incentive for people to enter the program and also for children to practice and build interest in their musical instrument. Mums and dads, please encourage your children to practise for 10 to 15 minutes, four to five times a week.

We are looking forward to a visit from Julie Logan, a leading educator in Early Childhood Music. Julie will be holding a workshop on Saturday August 31st from 2pm to 4pm with plenty of hands-on activities using songs, rhymes and recorded music for Preschool and early Stage 1 Children's Music. 2014 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Each year Central Coast Conservatorium receives funds from its generous sponsors for Scholarships and Bursaries. These funds are distributed directly to students under one of the following three categories: 1) participation, 2) excellence and 3) bursaries.

1. Participation scholarships are to encourage young students to continue or broaden their study. They include Level 4 Scholarships for young students entering our Levels Program through the Children's Music Program, Year 6 Scholarships for students transitioning from the Primary Schools Band Program into our progressive one-to-one lesson program, and Second Ensemble Scholarships for students wanting to participate in more than one ensemble.

2. Scholarships for Excellence are awarded for excellence and it is these scholarships that we are celebrating tonight at our annual Sponsors' Concert. Students awarded these scholarships have been selected through a competitive auditioning process. These scholarships assist students to extend their lesson time and thereby ramp up their skills on their instrument.

a. **Chamber Music Scholarships** are awarded to students who have applied for a Scholarship and been selected for a Chamber Group. In 2013 our Chamber Groups included: the Woodwind Quintet, the Jazz Ensemble and five Strings

Chamber Groups. These groups perform at our biannual Chamber Groups Concert as well as performing in the community.

3. Bursary Program

The Conservatorium bursary program is separate from the scholarship program and is for families who need financial assistance for the child or children to receive music tuition.

The Scholarship audition is an important event for our students and, together with their tutors, they will prepare a number of items to present at the audition. Conservatorium tutors and our Artistic Director adjudicate the auditions and often outside musicians are also brought in as adjudicators.

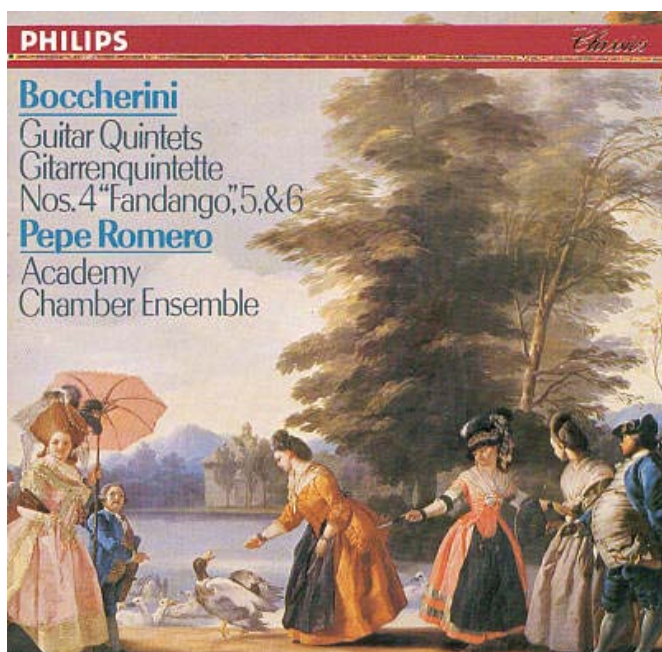

ROD'S REVIEW

Paul Grabowsky Concert, Saturday 3rd August in the Robert Knox Hall



The Central Coast Conservatorium proudly presented Paul Grabowsky, pianist, composer, Founder and Artistic Director of the Australian Art Orchestra and Professor of Music at Monash University (Melbourne) in workshop and concert on Saturday 3rd August in the Robert Knox Hall.

For those who attended Paul's workshop, this was a great opportunity for to gain an insight into the processes involved in improvising and to understand harmonic relationships in a clear and logical manner. Paul related his own musical journey and piano studies in Melbourne from a young age. For classical musicians in attendance, Paul attempted to demystify improvisation and make the first steps at improvising far less daunting by inviting young pianist Patrick Harrison (pictured above with Paul) to improvise with him on Miles Davis' composition "So What". Paul sight-read an arrangement of "The St Louis Blues" (by William Christopher Handy) and then proceeded to demonstrate how he would develop and arrive at his own improvisations on the piece.

During his evening solo piano concert, Paul showcased his own compositions (including "Angel", "Coal for Cook" and "October"), demonstrating his advanced harmonic skills and impressive command of the piano. Paul also featured compositions by legendary Jazz pianists such as Duke Ellington's ballad "I Got It Bad And That Ain't Good", Thelonious Monk's evocative "Round Midnight" and Bud Powell's joyous "Dance Of The Infidels".

Many thanks go to Paul for most generously performing for the Central Coast Conservatorium and for hosting a highly educational workshop.
