Dear Parents,

As you are aware the Central Coast Primary Wind Ensemble has been invited to perform at NSSWE's Spring Music Festival on:

Sunday 8 September at 1pm in the Concert Hall, The Concourse, Chatswood

The Northern Sydney Symphonic Wind Ensemble (NSSWE) is an extension music program open to students of woodwind, brass or percussion from the northern Sydney region. Our Spring Music Festival promises to be an exciting concert series showcasing over 40 schools from our local community.

Arrival & Drop off

Your school band has been allocated a muster point as shown below and on the attached map. Please drop your child off in their band uniform punctually at the muster point and have their name marked off the roll. The supervisors from your school will move the children through the stage door at a set time. As we need to enter, off load instruments and seat more than 300 performers per concert each school has a small window of time to enter the stage door and performers can only enter in their school group. Due to strict venue regulations individual children cannot be received at the stage door, and late arrivals may be unable to perform.

Your child's muster point is:	D
Your muster (arrival) time is:	11.45am
Your child needs:	Instrument, music, light snack and drink
What your child should wear:	Band uniform

Dismissal and Pick up

During the concert and interval, students will be seated in the Dress Circle with their Conductor and supervisors. For security reasons, and out of respect for all the other school bands taking part, children will not be dismissed until concert is finished. When the auditorium lights go up, musicians will be escorted back to their warm up room to collect their belongings. They will then be taken back to their muster point, band by band, to meet you. In summary, **when the concert has finished, please return to where you dropped your child off to collect them. Students will not be released from Stage Door.**

Please make sure you're your child has eaten before coming to the concert. A non-sugary drink and a sandwich may be brought into the backstage area.

The NSSWE Spring Music Festival provides school bands with the opportunity to perform in one of Sydney's newest concert halls in front of an appreciative audience. There is no pressure or competition involved. I am sure you will be thrilled to see your child on this world-class stage and I encourage you to invite your family, relatives, friends and neighbours to enjoy this musical event and to show your support for all the young musicians.
