



Instrumental and Vocal Studies with UNE

UNE and the Central Coast Conservatorium of Music (CCCM) have developed an exciting new partnership where Bachelor of Music students can undertake instrumental and/or vocal tuition with highly skilled CCCM teachers.

The Instrumental and Vocal Studies program offers a sequence of advanced performance training units over the course of the 3- year Bachelor of Music degree. Utilising the experience and expertise of CCCM's teachers, each unit incorporates weekly one to one instrumental lessons alongside a host of activities provided by CCCM and the community. These include participation in large and small ensembles, master classes and workshops with world-class special guest musicians, accompanying and/or conducting work, and concerts and public performances.

Eligible students are now able to continue studying online at UNE combined with face-to-face instrumental tuition on campus at The Central Coast Conservatorium of Music.
