CONSERVATORIUM IS TO YOU AND TO THE COMMUNITY!**

The Central Coast Conservatorium is one of the 17 regional conservatoriums which are members of the Association of Regional Conservatoriums NSW. Your Director Chris Bearman represents our Conservatorium, and sits on the Executive of the Association.

Although our Conservatorium is primarily funded by student fees, our very successful broad-based teaching programmes produce an overall operating shortfall. This shortfall each year has to be met by a funding package from the State Government. Without that package each year, we simply could not offer what we do.

Over the past 2 years the Association has been working extremely hard lobbying the State Government to increase its funding for Regional Conservatoriums like ours. **The State Government has now set up a review committee to examine if and how regional conservatorium programmes might be sustained by reviewing the current funding mechanism.**

Funding has not been reviewed since 2001 despite the teaching hours across the state having risen by 30% since that time. With rising costs and increasing demand, the students in Regional Conservatoriums have

been carrying the financial burden and managements have been constrained in their operations. For the Central Coast Conservatorium, a positive review resulting in an urgent injection of support is essential to ensuring our long-term survival.

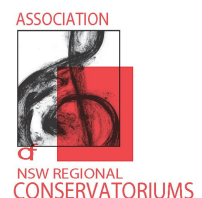

..CHANGE NOW!!



Since the last edition of Perfect Pitch, many students will have taken part in the Eisteddfods (both here and in Sydney); AMEB exams; Conservatorium Assessments and other Competitions. Winning or achieving a good mark is always a great feeling but don't forget to **read the report sheet.**

Generally speaking your report sheet will have been written by an experienced musician who is hearing you for the first and only time. Their report will be based on first impressions of you as a performer at your level with no previous knowledge.

This is valuable information for all performers even if sometimes it is a little difficult to swallow. Quite often a reference will be made to a technical aspect of your playing,

already identified by your tutor and reiterated by the examiner or assessor. **Why Wait, Change Now** or at least experiment and try to understand what is being suggested. The new suggestion is usually quite possible; the problem is remembering to do it when the old feels familiar and comfortable. Just accept that you are human; no one likes change we relish what is familiar and comfortable.

As a performer you have to find a way to feel comfortable with the new and challenging; that is why we have concert practice so you can monitor your own changes as you develop.

Nevertheless if you did win or achieve a high mark you deserve a **Well Done!!!** From all of us here at the Con.

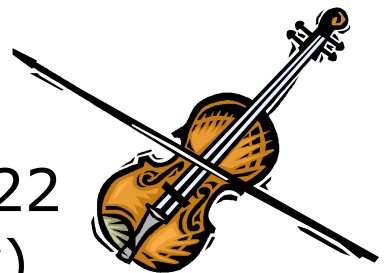
