Since our last edition of PP there have been several significant performances and events. This issue is devoted mainly to them. Congratulations to the students and thanks to the tutors who worked hard to bring them to a successful conclusion.



Conservatorium Senior String Chamber Music Group was awarded the prize for **"the most promising"** ensemble in the Australian Secondary Schools Chamber Music Competition held at Barker College earlier this month. Adjudicator Robert Masters awarded the CC ensemble 3rd prize with the title of having the most potential. The string quintet **Miranda Arrighi; Sarah Whyte (violins) Julia Doukakis; Amba Mercuri (violas) Lewis Wand (cello)** (pictured above) played two movements from Dvorak's String Quintet in Eb Maj. A challenge for any group whether student or professional.

Congratulations to these students who showed commitment to the value of preparation and should continue to improve with more hard work; we will hear more of them later this year.

The second **Crossroads Chamber Music Festival** was held on the first weekend in September. It impacted on the Conservatorium's performance programme in two significant ways. **Senior String Orchestra** and Concertante Ensemble combined with the visiting Wilhelm Quartet from the Royal Academy in London to perform 'Introduction and Allegro for Strings' by Elgar. This performance was truly unique in that it gave students the opportunity to sit and perform alongside their tutors in an ensemble situation. We hope that they all learnt a good deal observing how professional musicians utilise the short amount of rehearsal time to produce a result.

The Wilhelm Quartet was also inspiring for students to listen to; they were extremely polished and were a shining example of total commitment. The Quartet's violist is Glen Donnelly who not so long ago was himself a member of the CC Conservatorium Senior String Orchestra.

Congratulations to all students. The performance received a standing ovation from a good sized audience.

TRIP TO WAGGA

Friday 28th – Sunday 30th August 2009

Over 20 of our young **Junior String Orchestra** players, most of whom are members of Junior String Orchestra made a trip to the Riverina Conservatorium in Wagga Wagga to assist them in producing their first symphony concert. We all waited patiently for the bus which was delayed on the freeway for over 2 hours before arriving to pick us up. Students were treated to an impromptu scale class in the hall to pass the time. Finally we got under way shortly after 11am.

Following our arrival in the evening we went to Wagga Civic Theatre and rehearsed with the full Symphony Orchestra. The concert was made possible due to a collaboration between Riverina Con and Kapooka Army Band which is based near Wagga Wagga.

The army looked after all the logistics and made their equipment available for the concert; they also provided many principal players from their band to play the essential parts in the woodwind and brass sections and also their Musical Director to conduct the concert.

The Civic Theatre was granted for the occasion free of charge by the Local Council. With 80 – 90 people it was a very exciting experience for all our students; for some it was the first time playing in a symphony orchestra and for all it certainly was the biggest orchestra they have ever played in.

The general consensus was that it was very exciting to hear such a big orchestral sound. Everyone rose to the challenge of the performance on Saturday night, to a full hall of 500 people. Suzie and I played in the orchestra for the performance and after the concert one had the feeling that a contribution had come from every part of the community to make this special event happen. Something we still find difficult to achieve here on the Central Coast.

On the Sunday we joined with the Wagga Strings in the morning for some fun repertoire; we were also joined by Tristan; 2 years old, the Director's son (pictured on our notice board) having his first go at violining. A BBQ preceded the journey home.

Despite the grueling schedule our hope that all students would fall asleep on the bus was not realized.

Instead we were treated to the sound of excited chatter and low key high spirits; which just proves that making music keeps you alive, stimulated and happy.

OPERA WAS HUGE SUCCESS!

Now in its second year since its formation, the Central Coast Conservatorium Opera Company proudly presented its 2nd Opera production, a one act children's Opera – "Brundibar", over the weekend of the 8th and 9th August. Partially funded by D.E.T. and directed by Judy Marshall-Schutte and Lilija Sile and conducted by John Nottle, the vocal students and Youth Orchestra did a fine job bringing to life this historically significant Opera which was first performed by Jewish children orphaned during the Second World War. Most of the cast of children were later

transferred to a ghetto where they were reunited with the composer, Hans Krasa. Krasa re-composed the Opera from memory. After a month of rehearsals, the children did 55 performances. Sadly, most of the children, and Krasa were later transferred to an extermination camp. Despite its gloomy history, the score, libretto (translated by Tony Kushner) and happy ending won the hearts of Central Coast audiences who gathered to watch the Opera at Liberty Family Church.

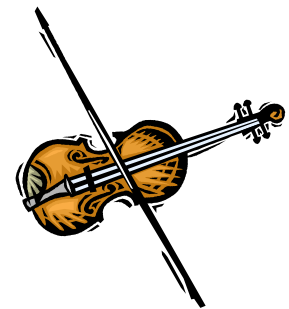
